

Protect children 6 months and older with their COVID-19 vaccine

Everyone 6 months to 5 years old is eligible to be vaccinated

Both the Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines are available for children ages 6 months and older.

- The Moderna vaccine for children ages 6 months through 5 years is a two-dose primary series.
- The Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine for children ages 6 months through 4 years is a three-dose primary series.

The vaccines teach our bodies how to recognize and fight the virus that causes COVID-19. The Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines were proven safe and effective during robust clinical trials with thousands of children. COVID-19 vaccines have undergone – and will continue to undergo – the most intensive safety monitoring in U.S. history.

Just like adults, children can become severely ill from COVID-19, be hospitalized, and even die. Children can experience short and long-term health complications that can affect their mental and physical health as well as their quality of life. Even healthy children without underlying medical conditions can get severe COVID-19 or suffer from long-term health complications.

Parents make decisions every day to protect their children, and now COVID-19 vaccines are available to protect all children 6 months and older.



What changes once you are vaccinated:

- ✓ You can resume activities that you did prior to the pandemic. Masking is still recommended for people 2 years and older when the COVID-19 Community Level in your area is high.
- ✓ Parents and caregivers are encouraged to register their children for v-safe to share how their child is feeling after vaccination.
